Introduction to understanding educational policies and practices

Understanding educational policies and practices involves locating up-to-date and relevant information about national, regional and institutional educational policies and practice. It also includes employing professional and pedagogical practices that are consistent with applicable policies related to a number of different areas, including the goals of education, learner empowerment, educational reform, inclusive education, literacy, child protection, the curriculum, syllabus and methodologies, teaching standards and many more.

This professional practice also involves reflecting on the impact of educational policies and practice on your decision making, professional behaviour and your learners' outcomes.

Where are you now?
