

# Teaching **English**Lesson plan

## **Rants and Raves**

## **Topic**

Mobile phones

#### **Aims**

• To practise listening skills

## Age / level

Adults and Teens B1

#### **Time**

30 minutes

#### **Materials**

- 1. Mobile phones worksheet
- 2. Audio script

#### Introduction

This activity provides short listening practice based around a monologue about mobile phones. The monologue relays how the speaker feels about mobile phones in society, particularly on trains.

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### **Procedure**

1. Warmer	<ul> <li>Elicit positives and negatives of mobile phones.</li> <li>Ask students to take out their phones and discuss together the relationship they have with the phone. (How often do they use it? What do they use it for? etc.)</li> <li>Students then discuss reasons why some people may not like mobile phones.</li> <li>Feed back and board answers.</li> </ul>
2. Presentation of language	<ul> <li>Give out audio scripts cut up into strips.</li> <li>Now ask students to try to put the strips into a coherent monologue.</li> <li>Students can circulate when finished to check answers.</li> </ul>
3. Listening 1	Students listen and check answers
4. Listening 2	<ul> <li>Take away strips and then ask students to answer the questions on the worksheet.</li> <li>Listen and check.</li> </ul>
5. Follow-up	Complete extension activities as required.
6. Developing the theme	<ul> <li>The theme of mobile phones and technology is popular with students. You could use these activities to develop the theme of technology and mobile phones to review a variety of tenses and vocabulary.</li> <li>For example: <ul> <li>What's the best mobile phone/tablet/TV etc on the market? Tell a partner then report back to the class (to practise superlatives, past forms, reported speech)</li> <li>If smart phones hadn't been invented, how would life be different? (to practise mixed conditionals)</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
