

Journey: a long trip from one place to another. (n)

Stripe: a line of colour that is different in colour from the area around it. (n)

Bench: a long seat, often made of wood and without a back. (n)

Square: a public outdoor space surrounded by buildings. (n)

Vanish: to disappear suddenly from sight. (v)

Spy: a person who watches in secret to get information about others. (n)

Tear: a drop of liquid that comes from the eye. (n)

Gang: a group of people who do things together. These things may be just for fun or may involve crime

Bazaar: an outdoor street market made up of rows of little shops or stalls where people buy and sell things. (n)

Stall: a booth used by a merchant to show and sell goods. (n)

Sneeze: to let out a sudden, loud burst of air through the mouth and nose. (v)

Itch: to have a feeling on the skin that makes you want to rub it with your nails. (v)

Tie someone up: to fasten someone with something like a string or rope. (v)

Striker: the player in the football team who scores goals (n)

Beggar: a person who begs as a way to meet basic needs such as food and clothing. (n)

Goal: a result or end that a person wants and works for; aim or purpose. (n)

Reward: something you receive because you did something good. (n)

Tram: a public passenger vehicle that travels along metal tracks on the ground. (n)

Ferry: a boat or ship that carries people or freight back and forth across a river or other body of water. (n)

Chase after somebody: to follow with the purpose of catching; run after. (v)

Pound: to beat hard. (v)

Relaxed: free of physical or mental tension. (adj)

Steal: to take something from another person without permission and in a way that is against the law. (v)
